





CHOICE Academy – Panther CHOICE Academy is designed to increase graduation rates of students who have fallen behind in credit earnings. Additionally, the academy will support students who have or does not feel traditional instruction meets their educational needs. These students must be intrinsically motivated individuals who will value their self-worth and participate in experiences which will propel them to academic and societal excellence. Decreasing dropout rates and increasing credit recovery will be a focal point of this flagship initiative. In order for students to participate, they must complete an application and interview process. The program is designed for students in grades 9-12.

Reaching Educational Successes by Engaging Transformations (Grades 7-12)

PRIDE (Grades K-6)

RESET and **PRIDE** Academies – Panther RESET and PRIDE Academies are designed to provide students an opportunity to rebound from previous incidents. The academies will focus on social emotional learning, community service involvement, field trip experiences, mentoring programs, soft skills development, and self-resilience.

Office of Exceptional Children

The goal of The Office of Exceptional Children Services it to ensure that every student with a disability in FCSD3 is provided with a free and appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment.

OEC is responsible for the supervision of all educational programs and services being provided to children with disabilities. The offices located here include all school psychologists, OEC director, OEC clerical and administrative staff and the "Child Find" staff. Additionally all due process records are also conveniently housed at 209 Graham Road.

Adult Education

The Lifelong Learning Center also houses the Lake City office of the Florence County Adult Education Program. The Lake City site offers GED, High School and Generational Family Literacy classes are offered Mondays-Thursdays from 8:30 a.m.-noon. Night classes are offered for GED and High School diplomas on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5-8 p.m.
